

Mozilla Firefox and cookies

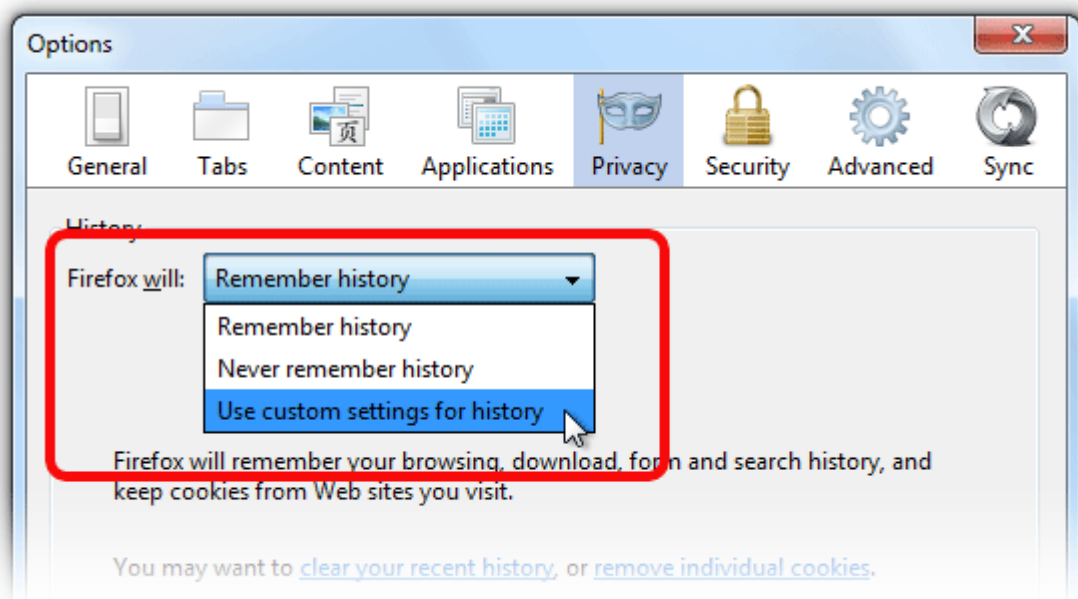
Unusually for a browser – all Cookies are enabled by DEFAULT in Mozilla Firefox. You shouldn't therefore have any issues accessing the members area using this browser. The only reason why you might have difficulties would be if your anti-virus software has changed this. The following steps therefore show you how to check to see if this is the case – and change it if it is.

This “cookie” is necessary because it stores your username and password data for the duration of the browser session. The “cookie”

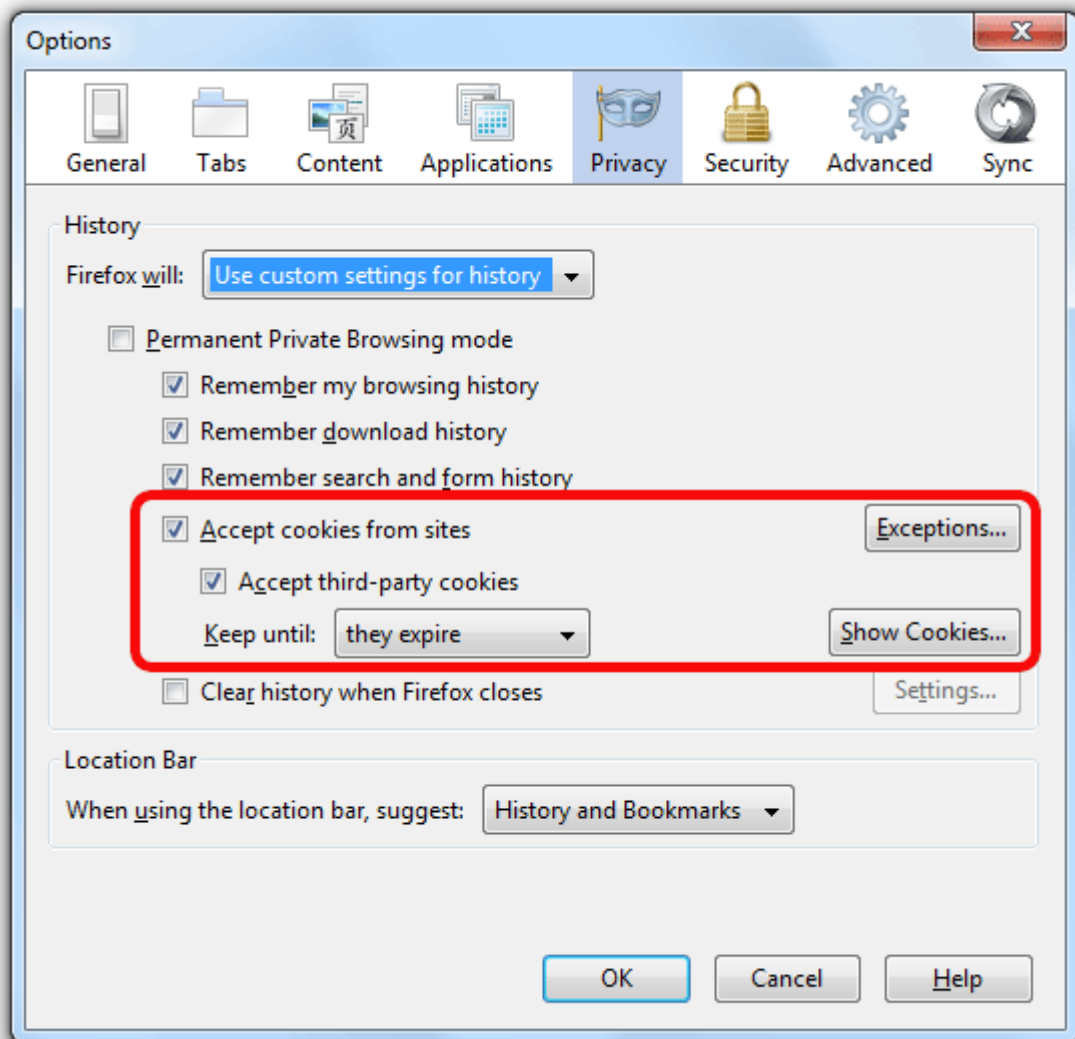
- Doesn't collect any personal information about you
- Doesn't collect location detail
- Doesn't modify your computer in any way
- Is erased upon you closing your browser session. Depending on your computer, there maybe a slight delay in this upon exiting your browser – but believe us – it is erased !!!

Step One

1. At the top of the Firefox window, click on the Firefox button (Tools menu in Windows XP) and then click Options
2. Select the Privacy panel.
3. Set **Firefox will:** to **Use custom settings for history.**



4. Check mark **Accept cookies from sites** to enable Cookies, and uncheck it to disable them.



- If you are troubleshooting problems with cookies, make sure **Accept third party cookies** is also check marked. For more information, see [Disabling third party cookies](#).
5. Choose how long cookies are allowed to be stored:
 - Keep until: **they expire**: Each cookie will be removed when it reaches its expiration date, which is set by the site that sent the cookie.
 - Keep until: **I close Firefox**: The cookies that are stored on your computer will be removed when Firefox is closed.
 - Keep until: **ask me every time**: Displays an alert every time a website tries to send a cookie, and asks you whether or not you want to store it.
 6. Click OK to close the Options window
